
It is very difficult to be a teacher at this time in history. And it is doubly difficult to be entering the profession at this time.

Vice-Principal's Message

TO THE GRADUATING CLASS

When I was young I used to think that there were in the world some wise old men to whom a young person who was puzzled could go for help and advice. All you had to do was ask and the wisdom of a lifetime would come rolling out to solve your problem.

As I grew older I found an acute shortage of such great sages in the world. Every mature man I thought might qualify had some obvious defect. Those I did consult very often gave pretty mundane answers about things. Often they would throw me back upon my own meagre resources. Of necessity I found that basically I had to solve my own problems. I could consult other people or read up on something, but in the last analysis always I had to use my own judgement and take action.

You no doubt are going through the same process. Though the college masters and the associate teachers can explain and expound at great length, you eventually have to decide for yourself what you will do in the classroom, be it clever or inane, successful or disastrous.

There is a touchstone that will help you, or rather there are two of them. One is to respect the truth; let your lessons express the truth with clarity and jewel-like precision. Refrain from limp and off-hand explanations or glib short-cuts. Respect the body of knowledge you teach.

The other is respect for the pupil. Though it is a truism often stated, many teachers fail to realize that if you don't respect your pupils they will not respect you. Accept them as being able to think for themselves. Listen to their ideas even when wildly different from your own. Assume that each child has a right to deserve your respect for his personality, whatever that personality may be. To condemn, belittle, ridicule or ignore it is to blight that child's development.

You may never be known as a great teacher nor write learned books in pedagogy. You will be honoured, respected, and remembered with affection, however, if you show these two simple forms of respect in all the years of teaching ahead of you. They will help you solve your problems in the absence of the wise old sages.
